Running Start

Running Start allows high school juniors and seniors in Washington State to take classes and earn credits at a community college. Running Start students who participate full-time can graduate with a high school diploma and an associate degree at the end of their senior year. Running Start students make up about 20% of SPSCC students and can participate in clubs, student leadership, and more. Students who place into or have completed English 101 (ENGL&101) are eligible. This includes public school, private school, and home school students.
