Scholarships

All applicants are considered for academic merit scholarships ranging from \$15,000 to \$26,000 per year. Talent Scholarships are available in Music, Theater, Art, and Debate. Puget Sound offers two scholarships that cover the full cost of tuition, room, and board: the Lillis Foundation Scholarship and the Matelich Scholarship. Running Start

Puget Sound accepts college credits earned while in dual credit programs such as Running Start and College in the High School. Applicants should apply as first-year students, not as transfers.

AP/IB Exam credits

Puget Sound generally accepts a score of 4 or higher on AP exams and 5 or higher on IB exams. A maximum of 16 units (2 years) of credit can be awarded.
