Additional Information

Admission to WSU is competitive. Admission offers will be extended to the strongest candidates in the pool based on their academic credentials including grades, completion of the College Academic Distribution Requirements (CADRs), grade trends and other information the student may provide. ***Washington State University will not require SAT or ACT scores for applicants seeking to enter the summer or fall semester (August) 2021 or spring semester (January) 2022. This applies to all campuses in the WSU system. Accordingly, in order to treat applicants equitably in the admission process, SAT/ACT scores will not be used as a factor in admission decisions for the entering classes of fall semester 2021 or spring semester 2022. No decision has been made regarding test score requirements for fall 2022 and beyond.**

Assured Admission:

U.S. high school students who are ranked in the top 10 percent of their high school class or who have a cumulative GPA of 3.60 or better (on 4.0 scale) are assured admission to WSU.

Running Start/College-in-the-HS:

Students who participate in Running Start, College-in-the-High School, or other dual credit programs and apply to attend WSU right after high school are considered freshmen in the admission process, and use the FRESHMAN application regardless of how many college credits they may have earned. They should also send official college transcripts if available.

Homeschooled Students:

Transfer Admissions and Deadlines:

Applications open early; students should apply early if possible. Priority date January 31. Apply at apply.wsu.edu.

Transfer students are those who have enrolled in a regionally accredited college or university **after** the summer following their high school graduation. Transfer students who have completed a full year of transferable academic college coursework will be considered for admission based on their college work. Students who have not completed a full year of

transferable academic college coursework at the time they apply may be asked for additional information for review.
